

## SCPTA House/Office - Bicentennial Landmark #43



The SCPTA office/house was designated as one of 101 Richland County Landmarks and considered as one of the the best surviving representatives of buildings - from colonial settlement to 1930 - depicting the county's overall historical development.

Selections were made in a three year survey of more than 500 structures on the basis of evidence of architectural or cultural significance. The study was conducted by the Central Midlands Regional Planning Council and Richland County Bicentennial Committee in conjunction with the South Carolina Department of Archives and History's statewide Historical Survey program.

A ceremony in September 1981 culminated a county marker program which was started in 1979 when properties in the City of Columbia were designated in the first phase of the project.

The marker is prominently displayed on the front porch of the SCPTA office/house at 1826 Henderson Street, Columbia, SC.
